The Management

Hotel rules & regulations

- 1. The obligations contracted for the providing of accommodation services are governed by commercial legislation and common uses and practices and will be applied at this establishment.
- 2. It is mandatory for all guests to register personally. In the case of groups, the representative of the group will register. The number of people permitted to occupy a double room is two adults, two children under the age of 11, and one extra person.
- 3. Guests will indicate the length of their stay on the registration card. A day of service ends at 12:00 hours. The first day of accommodation takes effect when the occupation of the room commences prior to 5:00 hours. The vacating of the room will be prior to or up to 12:00 hours on the same day. Guests will have a grace period of 60 minutes to vacate the room.
- **4.** All guests that do not bring baggage must pay in advance.
- **5.** The hotel does not accept personal checks or checks of any kind.
- 6. It is the obligation of the guest to settle the amount of the bill for the services rendered. This payment may be requested in advance or the guest must guarantee payment by signing a voucher, providing a credit card accepted by the hotel or by paying in cash. If the guest vacates the room after 13:00 hours, when the period of grace ends, the hotel may require payment corresponding to the following day's accommodation. If a guest fails to pay their bill, the hotel has the right to request the use of police force and may retain baggage in lieu of payment.
- 7. All baggage and other items guests introduce are considered the property of the person who registers for the room and this person is responsible for all debts related to accommodation, complementary services and other consumption. The hotel has the right to retain all this property as security if the client fails to cover their debt.

- **8.** The following are strictly prohibited:
 - Any inappropriate behavior or any acts that may bother other hotel guests (such as the making of irritating noise, the provoking of disputes, the introduction of musicians, etc.).
 - The introduction of animals of any kind into hotel rooms or public areas.
 - Damage to any furniture, decorations, equipment or property by using these improperly or in a way they were not intended to be used.
 - The removal of any object that is the property of the hotel, such as clock radios, alarm clocks, hair dryers, remote controls, towels, etc.
- **9.** Under no circumstances can a guest introduce people who are not registered at the hotel to their room.
- **10.** It is the responsibility of the guest to inform the hotel administration of any contagious diseases, deaths, infractions or crimes that occur in the hotel.
- **11.** The hotel is committed to complying in good time and in an appropriate manner with that agreed with the guest concerning the nature of their accommodation.
- **12.** The hotel accepts no responsibility for the theft or loss of items or valuables not deposited at reception. Safe deposit boxes are made available to guests in their rooms.
- **13.** If a guest is absent for a period of more than 24 hours without giving prior notice, the hotel has the power to terminate their stay, retaining their baggage in lieu of payment.
- **14.** Fast food delivery staff is not permitted access to hotel facilities or rooms. However, we will be pleased to receive these deliveries on behalf of guests and inform them of these deliveries from reception.

- **15.** We reserve the right to refuse admission to our rooms, restaurants and bars if guests are not dressed appropriately or behave in an inappropriate manner. People are not permitted to enter the bar or restaurant wearing t-shirts or shorts, or without footwear.
- **16.** The hotel does not provide guests with medical, taxi or babysitting services. These services are provided directly by third parties not employed by the hotel and must therefore be contracted and paid for by guests directly and independently to the service providers on the understanding that the hotel accepts no responsibility for the rendering of these services, their quality or the prices charged.
- **16.** It is the obligation of the guest to consult the prices and pay the providers of external services not offered by the hotel directly; however, if any guest requires the hotel to pay for the service and have this charged to their bill, the hotel can do so, adding its own charge but without assuming any responsibility for the service provided. To consult these prices and conditions simply dial "0".
- **17.** The hotel offers registered guests civil liability insurance in accordance with official Mexican standard NOM-07-TUR 2002. This will apply during the course of their stay at the hotel.
- **18.** A "reservation" is understood as a preparatory agreement for the contract taken out between the client and the hotel; to make a reservation a deposit is required for an amount equivalent to the total for the first night of accommodation. If the deposit is made through a bank or by any other form of remittance, and if no written confirmation is provided by the hotel, the hotel reserves the right to confirm the reservation when it receives your documents.
- 19. Any applicant that cancels their individual reservation enjoys the right to request a refund of the amount deposited when the hotel is informed of this cancellation at least 48 hours prior to the date the reservation takes effect. If the applicant does not cancel their reservation within this time period and does not occupy the room on the day of the reservation they will forfeit the full amount of their deposit.
- **20.** Guests are obliged to respect the internal regulations of the gymnasium, which are displayed in the respective area.

- **21.** Minors are not permitted to enter the hotel bar.
- **22.** The guest and the hotel agree that the following give cause for termination of their agreement: failure to comply with any of their obligations stipulated in this regulation, for which the affected party may rescind the accommodation agreement and demand payment for damages and interest caused by the means and in the manner established in applicable legislation and before the corresponding Authorities.
- **23.** The present regulation has been prepared on the basis of Federal Tourism Law and the regulation for lodging establishments, making this mandatory for the hotel and for the client.

- 2. If fire breaks out in your room report this to the operator immediately by dialing "0".
- **3.** If you believe you can put the fire out then do so; however, if you aren't sure please leave the room, close the door and call for help.
- **4.** If a fire breaks out in a room that is not yours you will be informed by means of an alarm, telephone call or someone will come to your room to warn you.

Services in your room



Medical and emergency services. The hotel does not offers its own medical service, but if necessary it can request this service 24 hours a day. For prices and conditions ring extension "0". This service is not given free of charge since it is provided by third parties and if required it is at the guest's sole risk. Guests must pay the doctor who provides medical care the corresponding cost for the service provided. Movies on demand. There is also a service offering movies on demand with these being charged to your room at a cost of \$133.40 Mexican pesos per movie, sales tax included. You can comfortably choose the movie of your choice using channel #1 of your television.

If you would like this service to be charged to the bill for your room, a commission of 10% will be added.

CribS. **This service** is offered at no extra cost upon prior request and is subject to availability. To make the necessary arrangements please ring extension 1729.

A Little History

The State of Zacatecas is located in the central-northern region of the Republic of México. It shares borders with the states of Jalisco, Aguascalientes, San Luis Potosí, Coahuila and Durango and has a surface area of 7,040 km². The state enjoys a generally dry climate with an average temperature of 16°C.

You can reach Zacatecas by road via federal roads 23, 45, 49 and 54, and by air from México City and Tijuana. There are also flights from the US cities of Chicago, Los Angeles and Dallas.

The name Zacatecas comes from the Nahuatl words —"zacatl"— and tecatl, and means "where there is abundant zacate (a kind of reed)". The area was originally inhabited by Caxcanes and Zacatecos, and between the 4th and 5th centuries A.D. the cultures of —"Alta vistas"— and —"La Quemada"— developed in Chalchihuites and Villanueva, respectively, and share unmistakable Mesoamerican features. The origins of this colonial city date back to September 8, 1546, when a group of Spaniards, led by Juan de Tolosa, discovered rich mineral deposits in the surrounding area. The nascent town was originally known as "the mines of the Zacatecas" and in 1588 received the title of the "The Noble and Most Loyal City of Our Lady of the Zacatecas" by royal decree.

The State of Zacatecas still has many worthy and beautiful examples of this cultural and historical heritage which include the Magical Towns of Sombrerete, Jerez de García Salinas, Teul de González Ortega, Nochistlán and Pinos.

These towns offer a wealth of values and traditions that can be clearly appreciated by visitors. These are places of extraordinary beauty and architecture and the local people possess a wonderful simplicity, which could in fact be considered the greatest value offered by the towns.

Places of interest

Casa de la Moneda (The Mint)

Founded in 1810, this building served as the second most important mint in México during the 19th century.

Cathedral

This cathedral is considered a masterpiece of Mexican Baroque.

Zacatecas Historical Center

The center of the city is the proud legacy of our forefathers and has been declared a "World Heritage Site" by UNESCO.

Cerro de la Bufa

This is a historical site of the early 20th century revolutionary movement where you can visit "La Capilla de Nuestra Señora del Patrocinio (Nuestra Señora del Patrocinio Chapel)", the "Toma de Zacatecas (Battle of Zacatecas) Museum", and also admire the imposing statues of Generals Francisco Villa, Felipe Ángeles and Pánfilo Natera during a visit to the Rotunda de los Hombres Ilustres (the Roundabout of Distinguished Men).

State Congress

A modern building (1985) with a facade that is a replica of the Caja Real Palace which was destroyed during "The Battle of Zacatecas".

Templo and Ex Convento of San Agustín

This former church and convent dates from the 18th century and the interior of the church recalls the former magnificence of the building erected by the Augustinians but seriously mutilated during the period of reform. The lateral facade offers an exceptional allegory of St. Augustine while the convent has a patio richly carved in an undulating baroque style.

El Edén Mine

A reminder of the region's mining boom, at the end of the 16th century the El Edén mine produced gold, silver, lead and zinc. In 1975 it was adapted to serve as a tourist center and this is where you will find the "El Malacate" discotheque.

Francisco Goytia Museum

The former residence of governors, this building is now a museum that exhibits works by Zacatecan artists including Julio Ruelas, Pedro Coronel, Manuel Felguérez and José Kuri Breña. Opening times: 10:00 a.m. to 17:00 hours, open every day except Monday.

Pedro Coronel Museum

The museum offers an excellent collection of art from all over the world (Greece, Egypt, China, Japan, and Indonesia, among others), as well as works by such contemporary artists as Picasso, Goya, Dalí, Miró, and Braque, as well as works by Pedro Coronel himself. Opening times: 10:00 a.m. to 17:00 hours., open every day except Thursday.

San Francisco Museum

This church and convent were erected in the 16th century and at the time were the most recognized centers of the evangelization of the north of New Spain. They are now home to the "Rafael Coronel Museum" which exhibits a wonderful collection of Mexican art that includes more than 2,500 masks from different eras. Also on display here are the city's royal charters, including El Título and El Pendón which are original pieces that authenticate the age of Zacatecas. Opening times: 10:00 a.m. to 17:00 hours., open every day except Wednesday.

La Toma de Zacatecas (Battle of Zacatecas) Museum

The museum houses a collection of images and furniture that help depict the city's revolutionary movement of 1914. Opening times: 10:00 a.m. to 17:00 hours., open every day.

Palacio de la Mala Noche

Built in the 18th century, the name of this palace (Bad Night) alludes to a legend associated with the mining tradition.

Paraíso Caxcán

Located 175 km. south of the city of Zacatecas on federal road 54 (Guadalajara-Saltillo) is a veritable paradise named "Paraíso Caxcan". This hotel—spa serves as an ideal spot for rest and for enjoying the thermal waters. It is nestled away in the natural landscape and offers all the services and comforts guests need for their rest and relaxation.

Teleférico (Cable Car)

In order to appreciate the whimsical design of the city and the clear blue skies of Zacatecas, there is no better option than to ride the cable car or "Teleférico" that crosses the city from the Cerro del Grillo to the Cerro de la Bufa.

Archeological sites

Chalchihuites

The —"Chalchihuites"— Archeological Site is an hour from the city of Sombrerete, which is 5 km away. It forms part of the —"Altavista" — Archeological area which consists of a group of sites that have yet to be fully explored and features galleries excavated into the rock that confirm mining was one of the main activities of this Culture. The archeological remains at this site include the —"Plaza de la Luna"— which features four rows, each with seven columns, which serve to represent the lunar month in its respective phases.

La Quemada

In Villanueva, Zac., you will find the —"La Quemada"— archeological site, also known as The Ruins of Chicomostoc, located 48 km southwest of the City of Zacatecas along federal road 54 (Guadalajara-Saltillo). Just 20 minutes from Zacatecas, it was discovered in the 16th century and since then has been the object of many studies. Hypotheses developed by a number of historians claim this site is seven centuries old. The site was given the name —"La Quemada"—, taken from the hacienda located near here, since its original indigenous name is unknown. The site features a museum, the —"Museo de Sitio La Quemada"—, which is open every day from 10:00 am to 17:00 hours.

Valle de Los Gigantes (Valley of the Giants)

Located 29 km from Sombrerete, Zac., along federal road 45, this area is better known as the "Sierra de Órganos". The name was given due to the forms taken by its immense monoliths, which resemble giants, towers and bell towers. These monoliths measure over 80 meters in height.

Nearby towns

Fresnillo (Zacatecas)

Very close to Zacatecas, just 63 km away on the road to Cd. Juárez, is Fresnillo, which also has its origins in mining activity. Today it is considered the state's second city.

Among its main attractions is the J. González Echeverría Agora which features interesting salons where you will find works by such notable figures as Manuel M. Ponce, Francisco Goytia and Daniel Peralta.


Other places to visit include the "Templo de la Purificación" and the "Iglesia de Tránsito", as well as the "Teatro Echeverría". The "Santuario de Plateros" (located 5 km from Fresnillo) is where local people worship the "Santo Niño de Atocha" (Holy Child of Atocha) and is one of the most popular and frequently visited religious sites in northern México.

Guadalupe – Zacatecas

Located 3 km from the capital, this municipality is considered one of the most interesting in the state. We recommend a visit to the Colonial Museum (Museo de Arte Virreinal — Convento Franciscano de Guadalupe) which houses one of the most important collections of religious art in the country. Also worth a visit is the "Capilla de Nápoles (Napoles Chapel)" with its eye catching decoration featuring moldings and reliefs crafted with different carats of gold leaf.

Jerez - Zacatecas

This town is located 57 km from Zacatecas on the Guadalajara road, taking the deviation to Malpaso. Founded in the second half of the 16th century, it is known as "El Vergel Zacatecano (The Orchard of Zacatecas)" and retains its colonial atmosphere, being both dignified and peaceful. Here you can enjoy the flavor of México's provinces and will find a number of interesting places to visit, including the following; El Teatro Hinojosa (The Hinojosa Theater), El Santuario de la Soledad, El Edificio de la Torre, El Templo Parroquial (The Parish Church) and the house where the poet Ramón López Velarde, famous for his poem "Suave Patria", was born.
